To accelerate progress:

For all pupils to make at least 2 sublevels progress in years 1 and 2. To address barriers to learning by providing opportunities for learning before and after school and to close the gap in the attainment of all children compared to National Data.

Additional Aims:

- for children to enjoy an enriched curriculum and a varied diet of learning beyond the classroom
- to raise aspirations of disadvantaged children by being offered extra- curricular activities and different life experiences that they may not otherwise enjoy
- to improve self- confidence and learn different skills through taking part in learning activities at After School Club.
