



SCHOOL SPORTS GRANT REPORT

2015-2016

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and Sport. The funding is used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. It is being provided jointly by the Departments of Education, Healthy and Culture, Media and Sport.

Funding is allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

At St. Charles we have received £8867 for the academic year 2015 - 2016
